PARENZANA – THE ROUTE OF HEALT AND FRIENDSHIP

Parenzana was a narrow gauge railway which connected Trieste with Porec, operating from 1902 until 1935 and was eliminated due to unprofitability, because of cheaper and faster road transportation.

The railway line was closed in 1935, but although it only operated for 33 years, it has left an indelible stamp on the entire region. At the 100th anniversary of the railway's opening, an initiative arose to restore this unique railway, which was connecting people and nations in the beginning of the 20th century.

Aware of the amazing beauty of the route outline, intertwined with the Istrian landscape, numerous passionate hikers, researchers, cyclists and nature fans have always been emphasising its potential.
